**THE UTAH DEPARTMENT** of Veterans and Military Affairs (UDVMA) and the Veterans Business Resource Center (VBRC) at Salt Lake Community College have launched a Veteran-owned business registry. This registry will help promote Veteran-owned businesses in Utah by allowing the public to search for and find Veteran businesses to support. The Utah Veteran-Owned Business

Registry can be found at <a href="https://www.veterans.utah.gov">wbr.veterans.utah.gov</a>. Utahns can search by keywords or by the name of the business. ### **Success Stories**

After decades of drug abuse and run-ins with the law, Carl is a Veteran who came to Workforce Services for help finding employment while he transitioned to a life of sobriety and met his court obligations. He had experience working in the plumbing industry but faced several barriers to enter the workforce again after many years.

The Workforce Services Veteran specialist helped Carl polish his resume and obtain a job working as a plumber for a large construction project. The ACE program helped him obtain the tools he needed for the job.

Carl has since graduated from Veterans court and was promoted to team lead where he now supervises a team of plumbers. He credits Workforce Services for giving him the confidence, tools and work-ready skills to live a sober and gainfully employed life.

## Accelerated Credentialing to Employment (ACE)

### THE ACE OUTREACH TEAM

assists Veterans, those currently serving (active duty and reserve) and spouses with obtaining certifications, licensure, clothing and equipment in order to obtain or maintain their employment. To qualify, you must have served one day of honorable service. Documentation needed is either a member 2 or 4 copy of your most recent DD214, a valid military identification card or a statement

of service from your current unit. Spouses must provide copies of the service members DD214 and a copy of a marriage certificate or their dependent identification card. Find out more information about the ACE program and how to contact an ACE specialist here.

THE UTAH STATE OFFICE OF

**REHABILITATION** (USOR) helps individuals with disabilities obtain meaningful employment, integrate into the community, improve accessibility and independence in their activities of daily living and determine eligibility for federal disability benefits. USOR hosts bi-annual job fairs to help job seekers with disabilities meet with employers, explore career options and attend workshop sessions.
