



UTAH AEROSPACE ADULT PATHWAY PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Utah Aerospace Pathways (UAP) program is designed to address the growing demand for skilled workers in manufacturing and composites for the aerospace industry. The UAP partnership includes: Boeing, Hexcel, Albany Engineered Composites (formerly Harris), Janicki, Orbital ATK and Hill Air Force Base. By completing the UAP Composites Pilot program you will receive an Aerospace Manufacturing Certificate. With this certificate you will be eligible to apply for a job with the partner companies involved in the project. After you have been employed for one of these companies for one year you are eligible for educational benefits should you choose to go back to school for additional training.



MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Eligible to work in the U.S. (U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident)
- Ability to pass a drug test
- Ability to pass a background check
- Have a valid government issued ID
- Have a High School Diploma or equivalent
- Complete TABE Test — 10th grade Math and Reading level required to begin
- Complete DWS Work Success Program
- Complete Work Keys Assessments — Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, Reading for Information
