Resources for ending domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking or sexual harassment

Domestic violence and sexual assault affects individuals across all races, genders, ages, economic backgrounds and religions. Utah has laws to protect and assist people who are vulnerable to abuse.

Domestic violence, abuse, and battery is defined as an act of violence or physical harm or the threat, attempt, conspiracy, or solicitation involving violence or physical harm from an intimate partner, family member, spouse, date or other relationship.

Domestic violence may include:

- Physical violence
- Sexual violence and even homicide
- Verbal abuse or intimidation
- Destruction of property
- Coercion, threats, kidnapping or unlawful detention
- Using children or cruelty to animals
- Minimizing, blaming and denying
- Isolation, harassment, voyeurism or stalking
- Economic or financial abuse

Sexual assault is a sexual act that is committed or attempted by another person without receiving consent or when a person is unable to consent and may include:

- Rape
- Attempted rape
- · Unwanted sexual touching

Stalking includes actions that cause a reasonable person to fear for their safety or suffer emotional distress such as:

- Unwanted and repeated actions, contact or conduct
- Watching and following from a distance or through third parties or surveillance technology
- Showing up at your home, car, work or school
- Calls, hang ups, texts and social media invasion.
 Contacting friends and family
- Making threats or sabotaging property, financial and reputation damage

Sexual harassment is unwelcome and inappropriate sexual remarks or physical advances in the workplace or other professional environments including:

- Requests for sexual favors
- Verbal harassment of a sexual nature
- Unwanted touching or contact
- Sharing of sexually explicit photos, email, texts or jokes
