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UTAH'S EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY: JULY 2013

SALT LAKE CITY— Utah's nonfarm payroll employment for July 2013 grew by an estimated 3.5 percent, adding 43,300 jobs to the economy as compared to July 2012. Utah's current employment level registers 1,280,000.

The July seasonally adjusted unemployment rate measured 4.6 percent, having decreased one tenth from June. Approximately 64,700 individuals were unemployed and actively seeking work. The national unemployment rate dropped to 7.4 percent for the month.

Utah's rate of job growth sprung back to an above-average level after experiencing two straight months of below-average growth. Labor force measures also exhibited positive movement as the size of the labor force and number of employed individuals grew and the count of unemployed decreased from June levels. Labor force participation also increased from last month and now registers 67.9 percent.

All of the eleven private sector industries observed posted net job increases in July as compared to last year. The largest increases were in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (9,700 jobs), Professional and Business Services (9,000 jobs) and Leisure and Hospitality (7,100 jobs). Government employment overall contracted by 2,900 jobs in the same period.





Year-Over Percent Change In Nonfarm Jobs




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
Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates
