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UTAH'S EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY: APRIL 2013

SALT LAKE CITY— Utah's nonfarm payroll employment for April 2013 grew by an estimated 3.5 percent, adding 43,100 jobs to the economy as compared to April 2012. This brings Utah's current employment level to 1,286,500.

The April seasonally adjusted unemployment rate measured 4.7 percent, having fallen two tenths from March. Approximately 64,400 individuals were unemployed and actively seeking work. The national unemployment rate dropped slightly to 7.5 percent in the same month.

Job growth rates in Utah remain above the state's longrun average in April. The labor market continues to grow and show signs of stable expansion as both the number of employed and the overall labor force size increase. The labor force participation rate, which measures the share of noninstitutionalized civilian population who are employed or actively seeking work, registered an increase of roughly three tenths of a percentage point in April. The number of employed individuals increased by approximately 11,900.

Of the eleven industry groups observed, nine posted year-over employment gains. The largest gains were in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (11,000 jobs), Professional and Business Services (8,100 jobs) and Leisure and Hospitality (7,000 jobs). The Natural Resources and Mining industry showed no change compared to April of 2012 and the Government sector lost approximately 3,100 jobs in that same time frame.





Utah Nonagricultural Jobs by Industry and Components of the Labor Force



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
