

REED ACT DISTRIBUTIONS
(September 16, 2009)

DWS received a \$61.6 million Reed Act Distribution on March 13, 2002 along with much smaller distributions in earlier years. The Advisory Council agreed to roughly divide the available distributions between employer interests and claimant interests. The following table reflects how the majority of the money has been appropriated and used to date. The “social security offset” for FY 2008 and 2009 were not charged to the Reed Act distribution but were included below since they were clearly a claimant interest. Some activities such as UI automation projects and supplemental staffing requests are not as clear how to categorize them since they could arguably benefit both interests.
