Moderate Income Housing Planning and Reporting

Population Criteria

Per Utah Code (Sections 10-9a-408 and 17-27a-408), certain jurisdictions are required to report on their moderate income housing efforts on an annual basis. While all jurisdictions are highly encouraged to include a moderate income housing element in their general plan, and to take proactive steps towards creating affordable housing, the Legislature of the State of Utah has set the following criteria for those jurisdictions that must meet the requirement:

COUNTIES

MUNICIPALITIES

First, second, and third class counties* with at least 5,000 people in the unincorporated portion.

First, second, third, or fourth class cities**

Fifth class cities with at least 5,000 people and part of a first, second, or third class county

Based on the above criteria, the following municipalities and counties are required to plan for and annually report on their moderate income housing plan progress.
