RE: Sole Source Aquifers in the State of Utah

Dear Ms. Brown:

The Environmental Protection Agency Region 8 (EPA) has designated three Sole Source Aquifers in the State of Utah: the first is located in Summit County near the Town of Oakley (Western Uinta Arch Paleozoic Aquifer); the second is in Grand County including the Town of Castle Valley (Castle Valley Aquifer); and the third is in Grand County near the City of Moab (Glen Canyon Aquifer). I am attaching maps that show the designated area boundaries.

As you are aware, federally financially assisted projects within the boundaries of these three areas are subject to EPA review for compliance with the drinking water protection goals of the Sole Source Aquifer Program. The specific provisions of the SSA Program can be found in the Safe Drinking Water Act, Section 1424(e).
