

THAT CHAMP ME KISS-FIST!



LEARNING IDIOMS AND PHRASES FROM ANY LANGUAGE IS A CHALLENGE, BECAUSE OF SEVERAL REASONS: CULTURE, IDENTITY AND ALSO BEING IN THE KNOW WITH THE CURRENT TREND OF LINGOS AND PHRASES USED IN THE COMMUNITY AND IN DIFFERENT FORMS OF MEDIA.

LIKE OTHER LANGUAGES, ASL HAS ITS OWN CHALLENGE BECAUSE IT REQUIRES ADDITIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING OF THE DEAF CULTURE AND USES OF A VISUAL LANGUAGE. SOME ASL IDIOMS ARE CONNECTED TO DEAF CULTURE NORMS, AND SOME ARE A PRODUCT OF AN ERA, OR A REGION IT'S FROM. OTHERS ARE BASED ON "A PLAY ON SIGNS", ADDING EXAGGERATION IN ORDER TO PUT AN EMPHASIS ON A PHRASE OR CONCEPT.

PARTICIPANTS WILL LEARN TO UNDERSTAND THE MEANINGS BEHIND ASL IDIOMS/PHRASES AND WHEN THEY SHOULD BE USED, AS WELL AS HOW TO EXPRESS THE CONCEPTS IN ENGLISH. PARTICIPANTS WILL EVALUATE AND DISCUSS THE WORD CHOICES THAT CAN BE USED DURING THE INTERPRETATION PROCESS AND COME TO UNDERSTAND HOW AND WHEN THESE PHRASES SHOULD BE USED. PARTICIPANTS WILL ALSO DISCUSS CURRENT TRENDS AND LINGO USED AMONG ENGLISH USERS AND HOW TO APPLY THESE IN ASL.


