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UTAH'S EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY: JUNE 2013

SALT LAKE CITY— Utah's nonfarm payroll employment for June 2013 grew by an estimated 2.2 percent, adding 28,200 jobs to the economy as compared to June 2012. Utah's current employment level registers 1,284,800.

The June seasonally adjusted unemployment rate measured 4.7 percent, having risen one tenth from May. Approximately 65,100 individuals were unemployed and actively seeking work. The national unemployment rate remained unchanged at 7.6 percent for the month.

Utah continues to experience positive job growth, but at a rate that has now slowed for a second month this summer. And while the number of unemployed rose for the month of June, so too did the size of the labor force and the labor force participation rate, signaling continuing confidence in the Utah labor market. Despite the marginal uptick in the unemployment rate, the number of employed individuals grew by 5,472 from May to June.

Of the eleven industry groups observed, nine posted year-over job gains. The largest increases were in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (7,500 jobs), Professional and Business Services (6,800 jobs) and Leisure and Hospitality (6,800 jobs). The Natural Resources and Mining industry showed no change compared to June of 2012 and the Government sector lost approximately 6,500 jobs in that same time frame.






