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UTAH'S EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY: OCTOBER 2014

SALT LAKE CITY— Utah's nonfarm payroll employment for October 2014 grew by an estimated 3.6 percent, adding 47,400 jobs to the economy as compared to October 2013. Utah's current employment level registers 1,359,500.

October's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate registered 3.6 percent, virtually no change from the prior month. Approximately 51,600 Utahns were unemployed in the month and actively seeking work. The national unemployment rate also exhibited little change at 5.8 percent for the month.

"The economic engine of our state has continued to move forward at a stable pace," reported Carrie Mayne, Chief Economist at the Department of Workforce Services. "Jobs continue to be posted across all industries, and as the weather changes we will likely see some shifts in the types of positions that are available for our state's job seekers."

All of the ten private sector industry groups measured in the establishment survey posted net job increases in October as compared to last year. The largest private sector employment increases were in Construction (9,300 jobs), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (8,700 jobs), and Education and Health Services (6,200 jobs). The fastest employment growth occurred in Construction (12.1 percent), Information, (8.7 percent), and Leisure and Hospitality Services (4.5 percent).





Year-Over Percent Change In Nonfarm Jobs




Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates




Utah Nonfarm Industry Profiles October 2013 - 2014
