UTAH'S EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY: AUGUST 2013

SALT LAKE CITY— Utah's nonfarm payroll employment for August 2013 grew by an estimated 2.7 percent, adding 33,200 jobs to the economy as compared to August 2012. Utah's current employment level registers 1,283,700.

The August seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased one tenth of a percent from July to 4.7 percent. Approximately 65,300 individuals were unemployed and actively seeking work. The national unemployment rate dropped one tenth to 7.3 percent for the month.

Utah's rate of job growth dropped noticeably from last month to a rate that is below Utah's long-run average of 3.1 percent. While the unemployment rate increased, so too did the number of employed individuals and the total number of workers in the labor force.

All of the eleven private sector industries observed posted net job increases in August as compared to last year. The largest increases were in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (10,500 jobs), Leisure and Hospitality (6,800 jobs) and Education and Health (5,500 jobs). Government employment overall contracted by 6,200 jobs in the same period.





Year-Over Percent Change In Nonfarm Jobs




Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates


